Licensing

Some occupations have specific requirements involving licensing, registration and English language before you can be employed. This may be a separate process to the skills assessment required for migration and visa purposes.

In many cases the requirements for registration and licensing are more stringent. For instance, an overseas teacher needs to obtain a positive skills assessment from Teaching Australia to obtain a general skilled migration visa. However, you also need to satisfy the registration requirements with the Teachers' Registration Board of South Australia to be able to work as a teacher here.

You need to investigate specific licensing and registration requirements thoroughly to ensure you meet the necessary standards before commencing the migration process.
